EASTON MANOR

Easton Manor is a community based residential facility that provides transitional living to adolescent males with Sexually Problematic Behaviors (SPBs). The program offers therapeutic, academic, and life skills support while youth continue their transition and re-entry into the community.

Concurrent Program Descriptions

Easton Manor has two program descriptions accepted by the state of Pennsylvania: a Medicaid funded program and a county funded program. This means we can accept both youth who meet medical necessity criteria, and youth who do not meet medical necessity criteria. In either case, youth receive the same high-quality services.

Structured Community Re-integration

The curriculum at Easton Manor provides a bridge between residential placement and the community through real time learning and community skills practice. Numerous and varied employment opportunities exist the program's vicinity. In addition to employment, other community resources are accessed providing semi-structured experiences that form a solid foundation for community success.

Life Skills

Life skills training is a priority at Easton Manor. Our PACTT (Pennsylvania Academic and Career Technical Training) affiliated life-skills program is an in-depth independent living and motivational curriculum. The focus, which is independence, is presented first through virtual simulation followed by practice in the real world.



Appropriate Youth for Easton Manor

Youth who have typically received and completed intensive sex-offense residential treatment or have engaged in problem sexual behavior not deemed to warrant more intensive treatment

Academics

An on-campus learning environment allows students to make the most of individual academic strengths while also developing successful strategies to cope with areas of academic deficits. Those who have graduate from high school can attend the local community college or other online programs.

Criteria for Admission

- ✓ Adolescent males between the ages of 15 to 20 years of age
- Youth who have a psychological evaluation recommending RTF placement as "medically necessary" (for RTF funded program)
- Youth who have completed Sex Offender treatment (at least up to the RP/Wellness phase) and are in need of a community re-integration skills or those with sexually acting out that do not warrant more intensive treatment
- Youth with an IQ of 70 or above
- ✓ Rule Out: Youth with active psychosis, homicidal or suicidal ideation
