Unique Care

The trauma focused **Girls Residential Treatment Facility (GRTF)** provides the highest quality professional care and treatment for teenage girls, ages 12 to 18, who are experiencing behavioral issues and mental health problems. In addition, CHOR provides a fully accredited, flexible academic program so that youth do not fall behind in school while receiving care.

CHOR's residential setting allows teens to focus on their mental health wellness under 24/7 supervision. Trained staff support the youth in working towards their goals for treatment using a trauma informed approach.

Through a mix of a weekly routine of individual, group, and family therapy, experienced and caring professionals challenge and guide each youth to heal from trauma, develop self-awareness, and grow skills to manage their behavior and mental health long term.



Staff Training

New Employee Development is inclusive of classroom and direct experience. Included in the training are modules covering the Sanctuary Model of Care, First aid/CPR, medication administration and behavior shaping.

Education Program

We understand that school can be a huge stressor for many of our residents. We work closely with each child's teachers and parents to find the best curriculum and setting (i.e., virtual, on-campus, alternate programming) to keep them on track and follow all IEP's. Our teachers work alongside other staff to ensure each child receives the attention and support needed to succeed academically.

Criteria for Admission *(some or all may need to be met)*

- ✓ Adolescent females between the ages of 12 and 18 years of age
- ✓ Youth with an IQ of 65 or above *(basic self help skills must be intact)*
- ✓ Youth with an adjudication of dependency or delinquency
- ✓ Youth with a demonstration of mental health needs or behavior support

Services Provided

- 24 hour supervised, structured, residential treatment
- Individualized service planning
- Case management services
- Psychological and psychiatric services
- Medical services including medication management
- Individual, group and family therapy
- Educational services
- Recreational services
- Discharge and aftercare planning

Length of Stay

The average length of stay in the Residential Treatment Facility is 9-12 months, based on medical necessity. This is entirely dependent upon the client's commitment to the therapeutic process.
